Laurie Jeremiah introduced our speaker Richard Donahoe from Tambo Waste (which includes Kwik Tip Bins).

Richard said that he was a local boy from Bushy Park where his family ran a dairy farm for three generations. He was the oldest of six children educated at Boisdale PS and St Patrick's College. He did an apprenticeship with Gippsland Hydraulics, then he drove trucks. He worked for ten years in the logging industry in the Thompson Valley. It said that "it was the hardest work you could do," but that it was also very rewarding and great experience.

During this time he was a young married man, and by the time he had four children he decided that it was time to work closer to home so he could help out

more. So he moved over into construction and earthmoving, then to Sale Logistics, and then on to Tambo Waste.

Tambo Waste is a huge business, with a very diverse recycling side. It was started by Murray Webb in East Gippsland. In 2000, they won the contract for East Gippsland Shire. In 2009, they expanded into Wellington Shire with Towards Zero. In 2013 they bought out Kwik Tip Bins (which is their commercial side). They have more than 100 staff, 55 of them in Wellington Shire and they run 7 transfer stations.

General waste ends up at Kilmany Tip which is now up to its fourth cell. They pick up 67,000 bins every month. 6,000 tonnes goes to Kilmany Tip, the recycling goes to Visy. Tambo are developing glass recycling plant at Bairnsdale. They already produce 5 tonne per week of crushed glass which is used instead of sand in concrete. They are looking to increase production to 15 tonne as very high demand for this product, and they are trying to reduce landfill.

In Wellington Shire they do 20,650 services. Kwik Tip bins has 2,000 customers for green waste pickup. They are mulching 5,000 cubic metres, end product is composted soil after twelve months. Double mulched green waste is used on paddocks by some farmers. Dutson Downs Waste has shut down receiving green waste as they have such a back log of material to process, they process to a much higher standard as they pasteurise, etc. Wellington Shire is aiming to introduce a green waste collection but it will need to be contaminant free.

Richard answered members questions, including on the hard waste collections, before being thanked and presented with a pen. Ted Pickering won the raffle.



President elect Rob McKimm speaks

President elect Rob McKimm spoke briefly about his surprise in finding himself in this new role, and asked for member's support. Sandra Houghton announced that the raffle on the Changeover Dinner night would support Rotary Centenary House as they are suffering a funding shortfall due to not being able to fundraise over the last two years. She is seeking donations of suitable prizes. PE Rob kindly offered a prize of a joy flight, but more prizes would be appreciated.



Mike Smith holds the floor

Mike Smith spoke about the recent interviews that were held to select this year's recipients of the Rotary Health Medical Scholarships for Gippsland. Three recipients from Maffra, Sale and Bairnsdale were chosen, one each from 1st, 2nd and 4th years of training. Mike said that they all were very impressive and articulate young people. He expressed concerns about the high pressure situations that they were likely to encounter in our over stretched health system,

and asked how we might promote pathways to medical training in this area. The Mavis and Bill Jennings Trust has been going for 17 years.

He added that Bill Jennings had ten days in hospital with kidney stones and is now quite frail, and that he and Mavis are now in Wilson Lodge.
